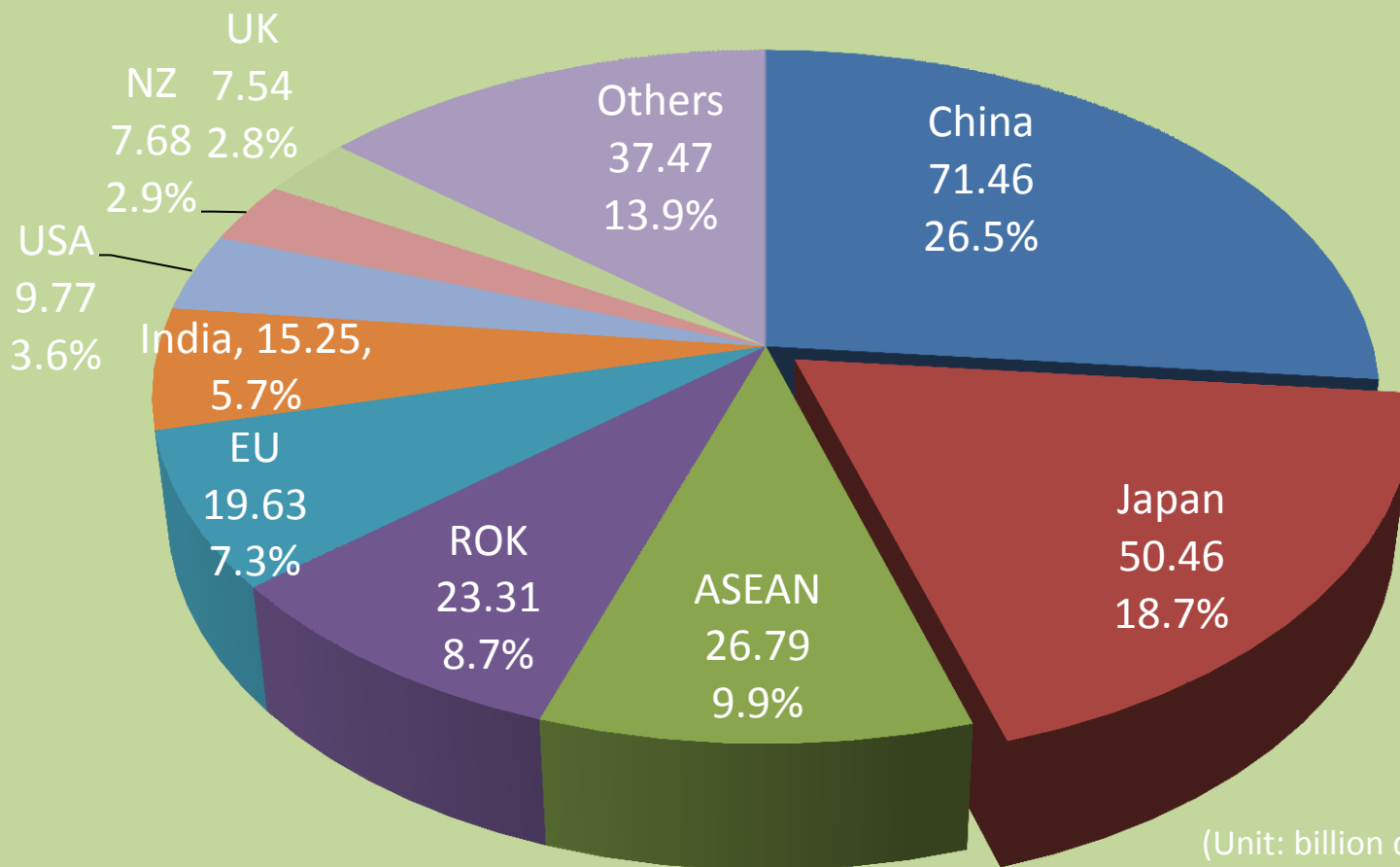

(Unit: billion dollars)

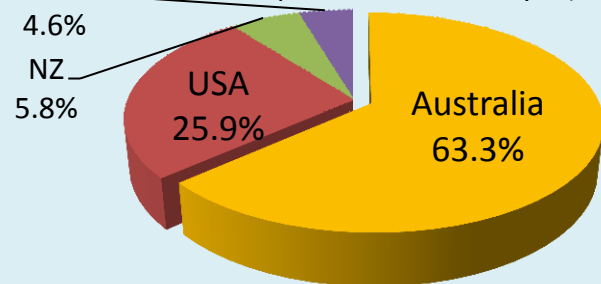

## Japanese imports of major commodities by country(2011)

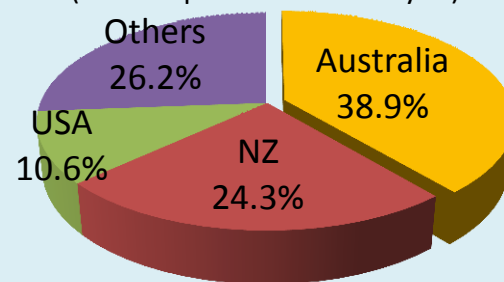

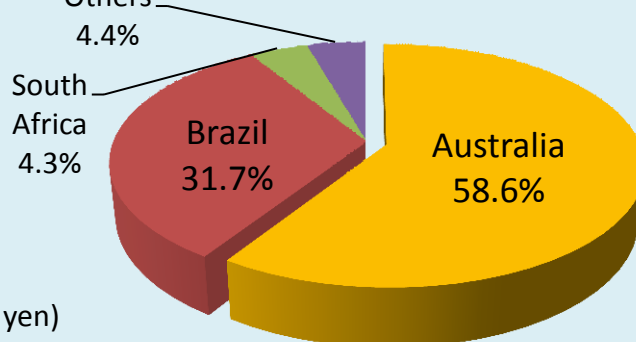
### NATURAL CHEESE

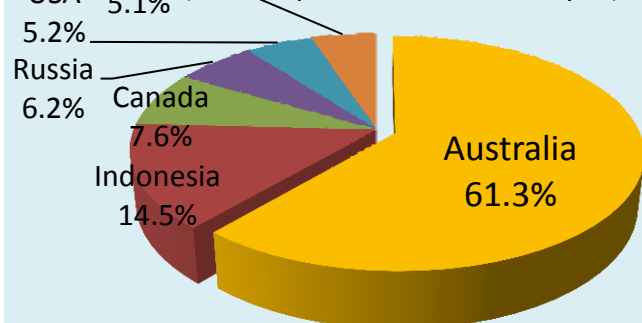
### IRON ORES

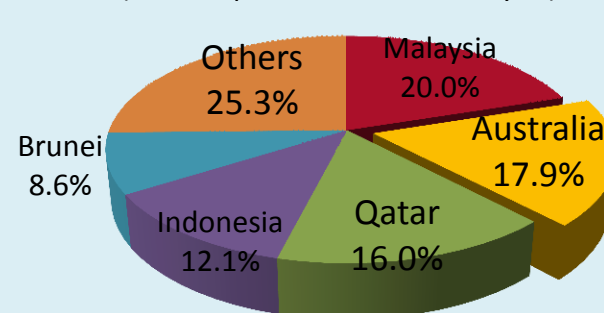

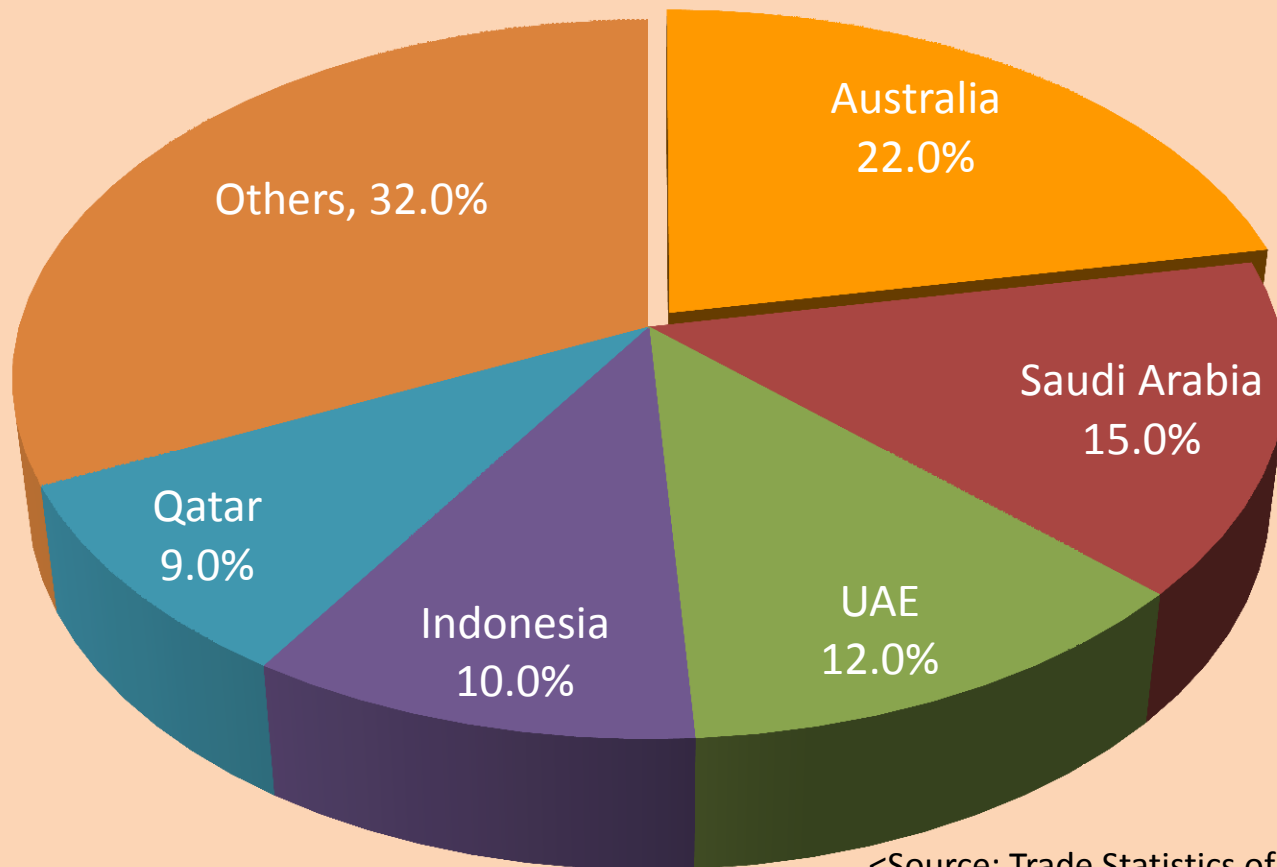

# Australia is Japan's largest supplier of energy

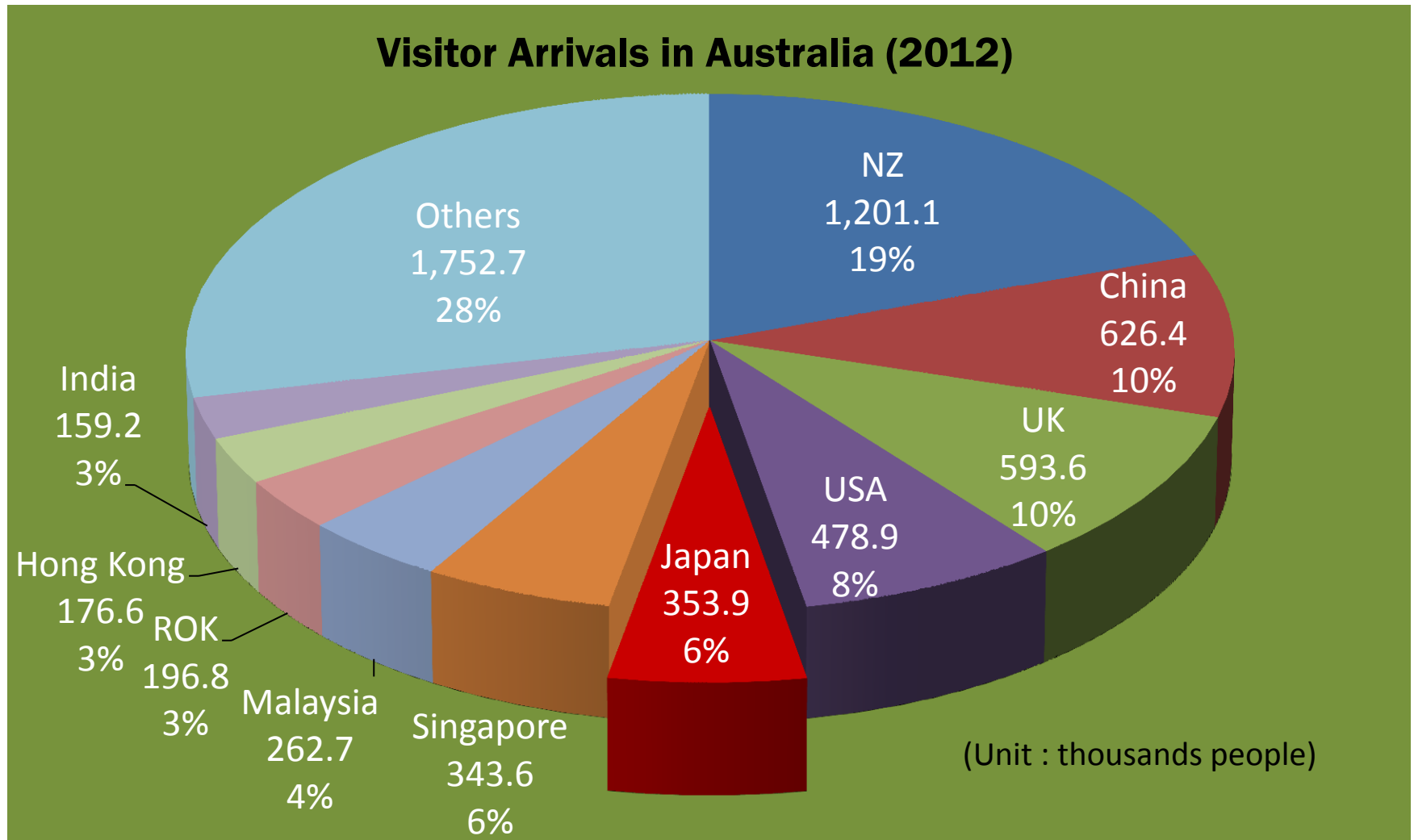
Total Import of Petroleum, LNG and Coal by Country (Convert LNG and Coal to Petroleum based on caloric value)

# Japan ranks fifth in visitor arrivals in Australia

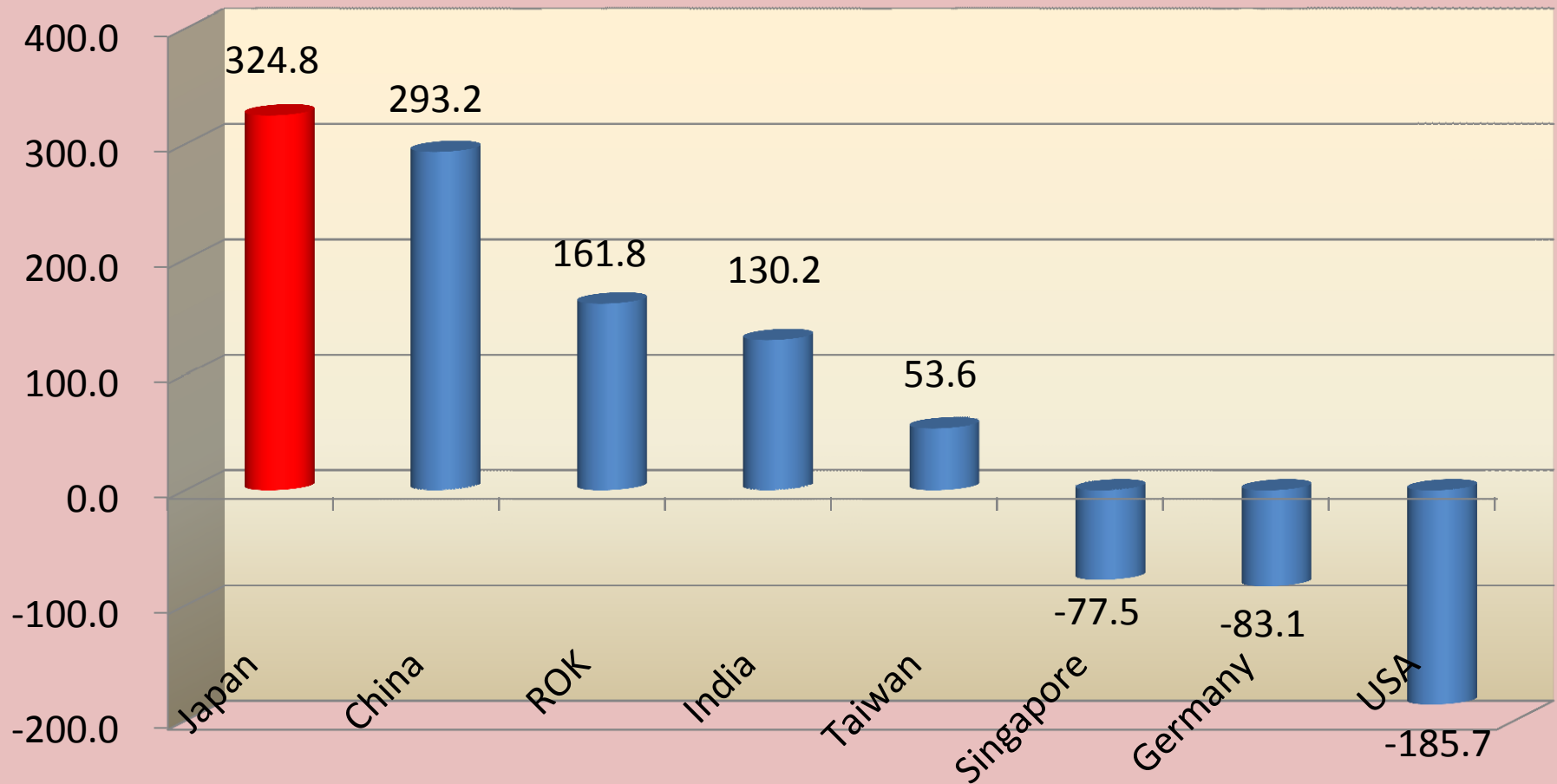

**Australia's Trade Surplus by country(2011)**

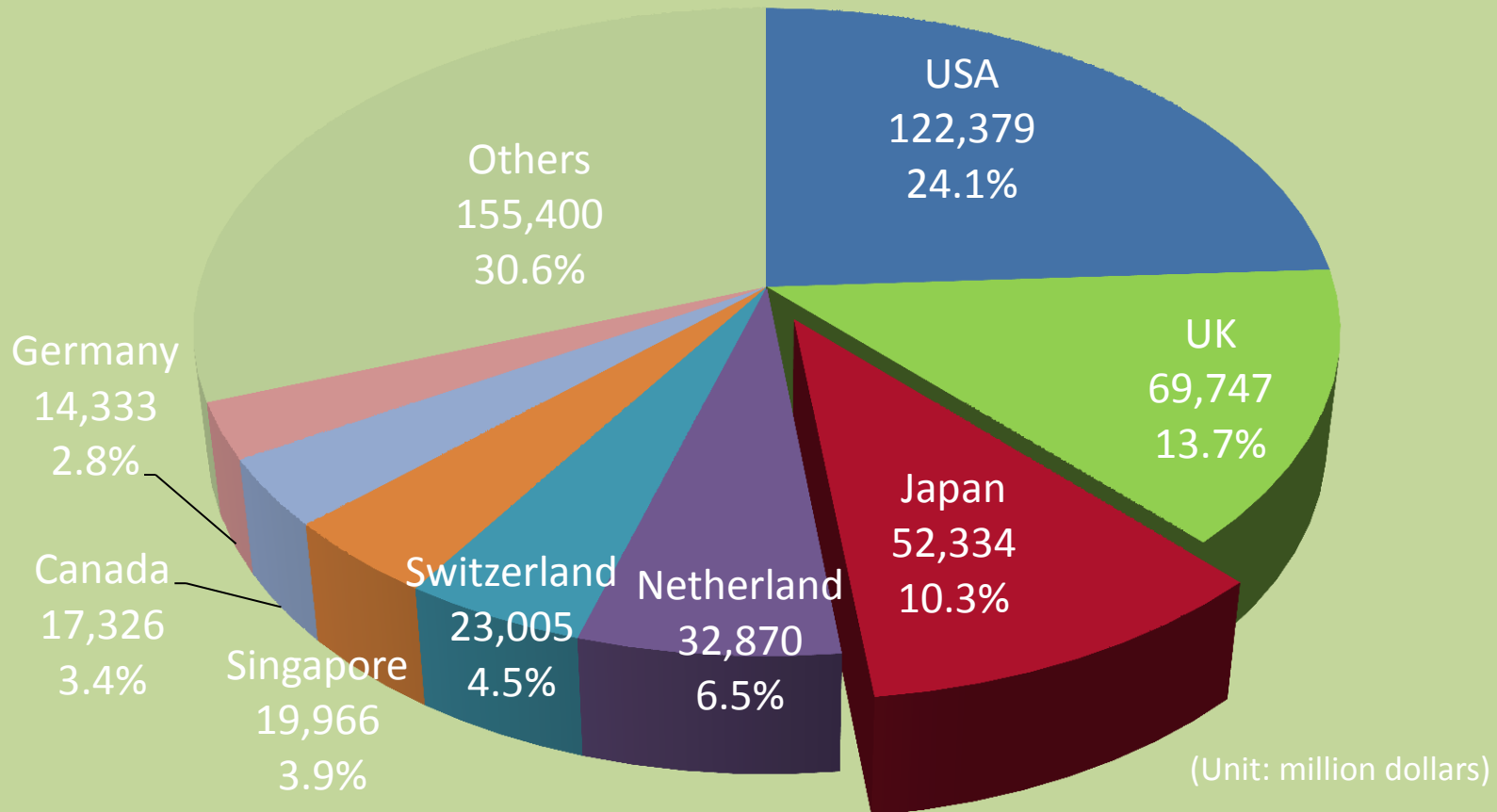
(\$100million)

**Level of Amount of Direct Investment to Australia by Countries(End of 2011)**



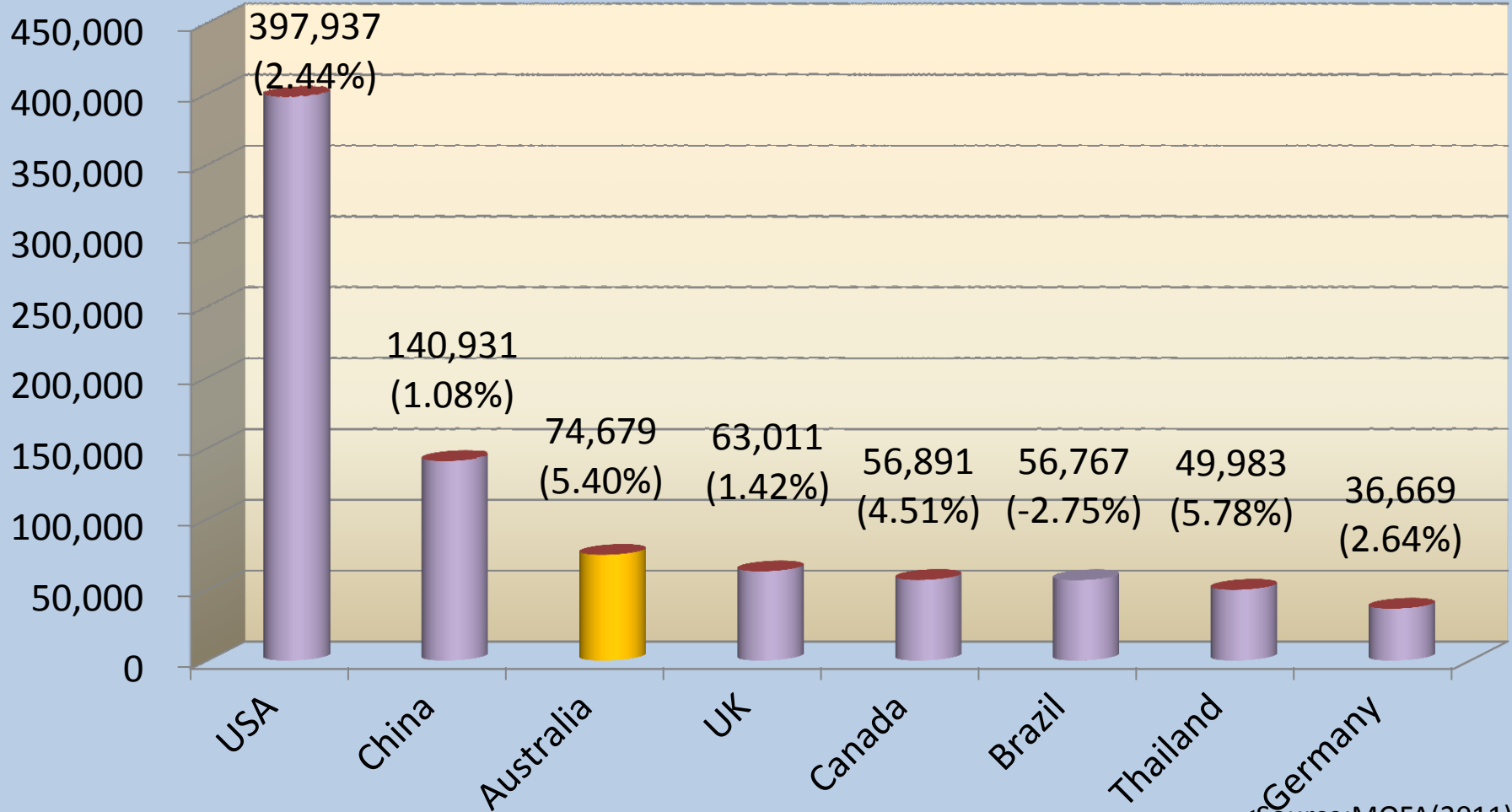

## Number of Japanese citizens residing abroad(2011)

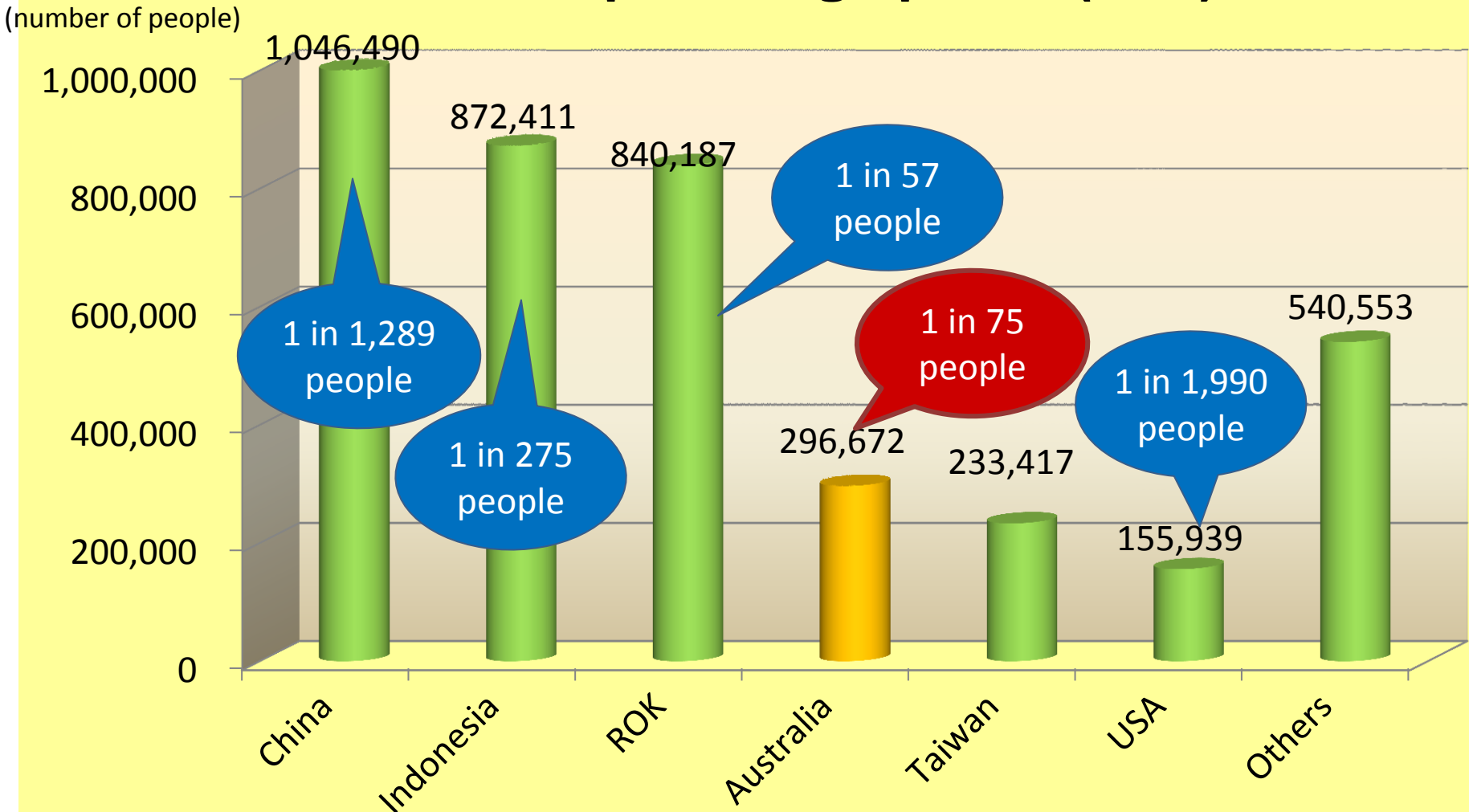
(number of people)
